



Arizona ATSSA Chapter Traveling Trainer May 18th, 2026

The Arizona Chapter of the American Traffic Safety Services (ATSSA) offers training anywhere within Arizona: We can come to you. Training can be on the days of the week / time of day that best fits your schedule, including Saturdays.

Requirements:

- Eight student minimum. We can teach any number of students from one to forty, but the minimum fee will be for eight students, except for FIT classes, which can be taught with less than eight students. A \$200.00 fee will be added for every FIT student less than the eight minimum.
- Provide a training room with tables and chairs, an electrical outlet, and a light switch. The ATSSA instructor will provide everything else.
- Classes can be either Open or Closed. Closed classes are for your employees only. If you allow the Arizona Chapter to enroll other students, you are hosting an Open class.

Fees 2026:

Traffic Control Technician (TCT): ATSSA Members \$200; Non-Members \$260 (one day course)

Traffic Control Supervisor (TCS): ATSSA Members \$390; Non-Members \$510 (two days)

Traffic Sign Technician (TCT): ATSSA Members \$435; Non-Members \$565 (two days)

Temporary Traffic Control Plans (TTCP) Members \$435; Non-Members \$565 (two day course)

Replaced TCDS - Traffic Control Design Specialist

Flagger Instructor Trainer (FIT): ATSSA Members \$460; Non-Members \$600 (two days)

Truck Mounted Attenuator (TMA): ATSSA Members \$125; Non-Members \$165 (1/2 day)

Retesting / Make up exams: The ATSSA fee for Retesting is \$60.00. The Chapter fee for a review at any scheduled class and Proctoring (administering the test) is \$50.00; the combined amount is \$110.00.

Note: There is a cancellation fee of \$50.00 per day for all classes (except TCT, TCS, & TMA) to cover student kit and Instructor expenses for "No Shows".

Whether taught by national, ADOT/LTAP, or the Arizona Chapter, **All ATSSA courses are identical:** All are taught by an ATSSA certified Instructor using the same PowerPoint and syllabus. The Arizona Chapter only offers classroom training - national offers both classroom and virtual training. Online training uses pdf materials, classroom training uses handouts.

If the training location is greater than 50 miles from Mesa, AZ (ZIP 85207), the instructor's travel and per diem from Mesa will be added as a surcharge:

For Closed classes (one company's employees only), a detailed proposal for the travel will be provided / agreed upon in advance.

For Open classes, a training room for 20 to 40 students is required. a \$50.00 per TCT student, and a \$75.00 per TCS student Surcharge for instructor travel will be added. 20 students is the minimum. The Chapter will do the solicitation for the additional students if you do not have the 20 student minimum. If the minimum number isn't reached, the requester has the option of cancelling the class or paying the surcharges for the number of students short of 20.

Government Member training savings: Public Agency Membership Dues for all employees is \$450.00 Membership saves \$60 per TCT student and \$120 per TCS student. The \$450.00 cost of public agency membership is recouped with just a few students.

ATSSA and the Arizona ATSSA Chapter are separate nonprofits, affiliated by purpose, with ATSSA being the parent organization.

ATSSA web page training (<https://www.atssa.com/training-certification/featured-courses>) is only for national ATSSA training: The Arizona Chapter courses are not listed on the national ATSSA web pages (and the AZ chapter doesn't have a web page). We send out emails with training announcements / enrollment forms. Certification is a step beyond training. It is only done by National ATSSA for trained individuals. The additional steps are application, experience, references, and a fee. Chapter only offers the training. <https://www.atssa.com/training-certification/certification-recertification> for further information.

Re-Certification must be done within a four year period of the course completion date. THERE IS NO GRACE PERIOD. If TCS has expired, TCS class must be taken again.

You can Retesting / make up failed exams online: Students have to log onto their profile at https://learning.atssa.com/Saba/Web_wdk/NA10P2PRD125/index/prelogin.rdf?signin=true to be able to view the makeup retests on ATSSA's Training web page. The electronic version must be taken within 90 days of a failed test. ATSSA will not accept any paper makeup exams. If a student is unable to take an electronic makeup exam before the TCS course begins, they can still attend, but with the understanding that they will not receive credit for either course until the makeup exam is complete.

To register for retesting / recertification, an ATSSA USERNAME / ATSSA ID number and Password are needed.
